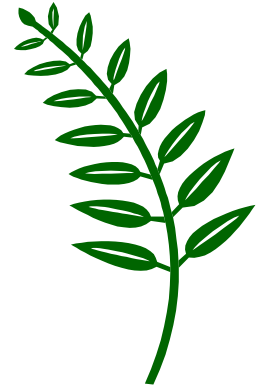

Tree Planting Tips

Species Selection

Consider the physical characteristics of the area you wish to plant: soil type, water availability, and intensity of sun. Avoid conditions around man-made structures: planting on septic drain field, planting trees within 12' of overhead wires and within 10' of building foundations, planting near road intersections.

Site Preparation

The leading cause of seedling mortality is lack of weed control. Seedlings do not compete against the more successful grasses and broadleaf weeds. When applied as directed, pre-emergent and post-emergent herbicides do a superior job of weed control and decompose quickly posing no environmental threat. With herbicides, the key to effective weed control is to apply it a season in advance. Application is best in the late Summer or Fall when “weeds” are beginning to store food in the root system. Traditional methods such as mulching, sod scalping, or furrowing methods are effective but labor intensive and sometimes create difficulties depending on the equipment used.

Planting

Always plant in the middle of the prepared area. Seedlings less than 2 years old usually have a small root system with undeveloped tap roots and can be planted by simply making a furrow or “wedging” a hole with a tree planter. For larger trees, dig a hole wide enough to permit tree roots to spread out in an uncurled position. It is particularly important that the tap root (the main root, which is the longest) is not curled. “J” rooting the seedling will stunt the growth.

Plant as soon as possible after pick-up and while planting keep the roots of the waiting trees covered. Don't allow the roots to dry out. Also, avoid other extreme conditions such as direct sun and high temperatures. Stress damage can occur to roots in less than an hour in extreme conditions and reduces the survival rate.

Spacing Guide

Intended Use	Type of Tree	Spacing	No. to Order
Windbreaks	Conifers	7' to 10'	10 to 15 per 100'
Windbreaks	Shrubs	6' to 10'	15 to 17 per 100'
Reforestation/Erosion Control	Conifers	6' to 8'	910 to 950 per acre
Reforestation/Erosion Control	Deciduous Hardwoods	10'	435 per acre
