Butternut	2- 3'	Native tree disappearing in this region; elongated nuts are more valued than wood for lumber. Deep rooted fast growing on well drained soils to heights of 80'.	\$11	\$19		\$
Carpathian Walnut	2 -3'	Produces thin shelled, easy to open nuts. Cross pollination recommended for nut production. Prefers light loamy soils but grows on most soil types to heights of 65'	\$11	\$19		\$
Filbert (Hazelnut)	2 - 3'	Producing edible nuts in late fall, excellent fall cover and food source for wildlife. Grows well on most soils and light conditions to heights of 15'.	\$11	\$19		\$
River Birch 	2 - 3'	Grows well in moist and semi-dry areas. Shiny red brown bark. Grows to 50' -70'.	\$ 9	\$16		\$
Red Maple 	3 - 4'	Vibrant scarlet to burgundy fall foliage. Gray brown bark that can grow typically to 70' but sometimes up to 100'.	\$10	\$18		\$

Danube Cherry 3/4"	Large, bright red, sweet tart flavor. Ripens early. Firm flesh.	\$ 16	\$ 30		\$
Skeena Sweet Cherry 1/2"	Large, dark, black sweet cherry. Ripens later, Crack resistant. Self pollinator.	\$ 16	\$ 30		\$

Crocsmia Lucifer 	A bag of 5 roots. Fiery red colored flowers, deep green leaves, blooming in July-August. Wiry stems about 24-36" tall, make it ideal for cut flowers. Plant in a sunny spot. Hummingbirds love them.	\$ 6	\$ 11		\$
Trillium Grand. Snowy White (Wake Robin) 	A bag of 2 roots. Woodland flowers are excellent for shaded areas covered with trees. They bloom in early spring and grow best in cool shady spots in moist, well drained soil. They also make an attractive ground cover.
